

Rockford History

Prewar settlement in Rockford – Excerpt from the Story of Rockford by Michael Vala.

The most important person in the company was George Wyatt, who had come from Rockford, Illinois, St. Charles (Charles City), Iowa, in 1854 with the expressed purpose of founding a village. Although his only real estate in the new village was block twenty-one where he later built his home and "Wyatt House" hotel, he was the company's land agent and manger. In 1856 he commissioned Alvah R Prescott to survey the site and plat the village. In later years Prescott recalled his first trip to the future town and described not only the new village site but also some of its earliest inhabitants.

Rockford City Council Minutes

October 11, 2022, 7:30 P.M.

- 1. The Rockford City Council met in regular session at City Hall on Tuesday, October 11, 2022. Mayor Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Present were Council Members Seibert, Hoffarth, Enabnit, Schlader and Medlin @7:42 P.M. Citizens present were Myron Stadtlander, Jim & Sandra Lawrenz, Liz Enabnit, and Neil Fullerton. Employees present were Randy Schweizer and Daniel Paulus.
- 2. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve the agenda as posted. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 3. Motion Schlader, sec. Seibert to approve the agenda consisting of September 20, 2022, Council Minutes, Monthly Reports, Claims & Expenses. All ayes. Motion carried.
- 4. Discussion was held on the upcoming workshop with Maggie Burger from Speer Financial who will present the water reserve rates for the water tower project to be held on November 1st @ 5:00 P.M.
- 5. Discussion was held on the property of 109 W Main Ave.

- 6. Motion Seibert, sec. Medlin to approve 3 red sunset maples to be planted in the city right of way by owner at 110 5th St. N.W. All ayes. Motion carried. The council would also like to look into changing the city tree ordinance starting at next meeting.
- 7. Discussion was held with public works department on how citizens could get firewood from city dump if they would like to. They need to call and make apt with the public works department.
- 8. Public works electric lines tabled until next meeting.
- 9. Floyd County Freedom Rock Sign tabled until next meeting.
- 10. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve the Annual Financial Report. All ayes. Motion carried.
- 11. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Medlin to approve Resolution #2022-23 setting standard mileage rate at 62.5 cents per mile. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 12. Motion Schlader, sec. Hoffarth to set Public Hearing Date to convey portions of 2nd Street SE from Main Ave to Alley for November 15th, 2022. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 13. Public Works Employees' Randy Schweizer and Daniel Paulus reported on stump grinding and snow plow repairs that need to be done and on the public works department yard cleanup.
- 14. Mayor Johnson reported on the county hiring a new EMA director and that the county will also be hiring a new county assessor. He also reported on the 109 W Main Ave property.
- 15. Motion Enabnit, sec. Schlader to adjourn at 8:15 P.M.


