Rockford History

Prewar settlement in Rockford – Excerpt from the Story of Rockford by Michael Vala.

The next few months will be the account of Alvah R. Prescott's first trip to Rockford to survey and plat our town.

We learned that the family had retired at half past nine and the light that we had a glimpse of was from the candle which Mr. Bailey had placed in a new position just before extinguishing it. Mrs. Bailey was soon up cooking us a supper, the quantity of which she knew well would be the most important part for us. We got to bed a little after twelve, two in the small loft and three on the floor around the cook stove in which we kept a fire nearly till morning. We had plenty of buffalo and blankets and slept not uncomfortably till sunrise. Cole and Bailey were the first out to see and feed the livestock and team. When I went out soon after I saw a very unusual spectacle in the yard near the shed. Cole and Bailey were hurrying towards each other with large stakes in their hands, running that way I soon found the cause of the strange proceedings. Mr. Baily, against Cole's wishes, had turned his team of work oxen out of their warm stalls and put our team in their places. One of the oxen had lain down on a heap of manure in the yard and had become cast, Cole and Bailey were trying to turn him over to possibly save him as he was yet quite warm, but to no purpose, he was quite dead, and the great, strong useful animal was a sad loss. Baily said that the oxen often spent colder nights in the yard and the accident might happen almost any day or night, he refused remuneration but slightly charged us for our entertainment. He showed us the way to Green's Grove about three miles north-west of his place, which we made in the clear, cold morning, arriving at Green's about ten a.m., where we put our team in a stable and accompanied by Mr. Green, proceeded at once to several tasks.

 - Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve the agenda as posted. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 2. Motion Schlader, sec. Enabnit to open Budget Hearing at 7:30 P.M. for the purposed 2023-2024 City Budget as published. Passed all ayes roll call vote. Mayor Johnson asked for any written or oral objections or comments: there being none, Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert to close Budget Hearing at 7:31 P.M.

- 3. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve resolution #2023-12 adopting the Annual Budget for Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2024. Passed with the following roll call vote: Ayes: Hoffarth, Enabnit, Schlader, and Seibert
- 4. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve amending the consent agenda consisting of March 14, 2023, council minutes with adding Lee Dodge to the list of citizen's present to Line item #1 and also approving March 24, 2023 council minutes, monthly reports, claims and expenses and Yesway tobacco license. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 5. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve the city insurance deductible to be moved up to \$5,000.00. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 6. Motion Seibert, sec. Schlader to put city property's RFD E20' W44' Lot 7 & RFD W1/2 Lot 8 both in Block 12 out for bid. Sealed bids are due back into city hall by Monday, May 8th by 4:00 P.M. All sealed bids received will be opened at the Tuesday, May 9th, 2023, council meeting at 7:30 P.M. The city does have the right to refuse any and all bids. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 7. Motion Enabnit, sec. Hoffarth to approve a one-time \$5.00 utility credit to fill out the city's Lead & Copper Survey. Those who are eligible must have city water connection to their property. The project deadline is October 2024. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 8. No action was taken on Railroad Crossings.
- 9. Discussion was held on asbestos grant and removal for property of 109 W. Main Ave.
- 10. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve sealed bid from JC Construction in the amount of \$17,800 to remove and replace the west park sidewalk. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 11. No action was taken on Campground rates.
- 12. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Schlader to approve purchasing a commercial sprayer from Mark's Tractor & Imp. Inc. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 13. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to approve Wedeking Electric LLC estimate for underground electrical work at the city's Public Work building contingent on that their October 2022 estimate price is the same and when they can start. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 14. Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert to approve Resolution #2023-13 SEH professional Service Agreement for Contract Administration. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 15. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Schlader to approve Resolution #2023-14 to fix public hearing date on proposal to enter into a Water Revenue Loan and Disbursement Agreement. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 16. Discussion was held with council on applicants for the Deputy Clerk position.
- 17. Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert to fix public hearing date on conveying property Lots 3 & 4 W. C. Johnson First Addition. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 18. Motion Schlader, sec. Seibert approved to get quotes on the cost of the City Budget Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2023, for Annual Exam. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 19. Public Works Employee Randy Schweizer reported on getting the campground & west park water turned on and parks ready to go, filling potholes, the street sweeper ready, getting new rock and grading the alleys, and picking up tree limbs.
- 20. Mayor Johnson reported on working on another grant for the 109 W. Main Ave property.
- 21. Motion Hoffarth, sec. Seibert to adjourn at 8:34 P.M.


