## **Rockford History**

Prewar settlement in Rockford – Excerpt from the Story of Rockford by Michael Vala.

The next few months will be the account of Alvah R. Prescott's first trip to Rockford to survey and plat our town.

On my return to our party, I found them all at the house of Mr. Horace Stearns just below the mill site on the riverbank, where I laid before them all the case of Mr. Walker. Our several missions having been served as best we could, we found dinner waiting for us at Mr. Green's, after which we were soon ready for our homeward ride. Just as we were hitching the team Mr. Walker came along with a bag of furs, concluding to send them to market by me, as he did not think a better opportunity would offer, as a neighbor, a Mr Dean and wife, had arrived at his house and would stay till he returned. I accepted the trust and was pleased to return to him the sum of forty-four dollars for his furs.

  - Motion Enabnit, sec. Hoffarth to approve the agenda as posted. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 2. Motion Schlader, sec. Seibert to open the Public Hearing at 7:30 P.M. to open sealed bids for City Lot RFD E20' W44' Lot 7 Block 12. Passed all ayes roll call vote. Mayor Johnson asked for any written or oral objections or comments: there being none, Motion Hoffarth, sec. Enabnit to close Public Hearing at 7:31 P.M.

- 10. Tractor tabled until next meeting.
- 11. 115 West Main Avenue tabled until a later date.
- 12. Motion Schlader, sec. Hoffarth to approve the use of Central Park and to block off streets near central park and some of Main Avenue for Rockford Fun Days/JT Days on July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023, and to also have a copy of the license of the firework provider and liability insurance paper paperwork into City Hall for that night's firework show. All ayes. Motion carried.
- 13. Motion Seibert, sec. Enabnit to approve Mac & Seth Hirv to paint & put new screens in the enclosed shelter at West Park for their Eagle Scout Project. All ayes. Motion carried.
- 14. Motion Seibert, sec. Enabnit to approve Resolution #2023-27 to fix public hearing date and time for July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at 7:30 P.M. for conveying city property Lot RFD W1/2 Lot 8 Block 12. Passed all ayes roll call vote: Ayes: Hoffarth, Enabnit, Schlader, and Seibert
- 15. Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert to approve Resolution #2023-28 transfer of LOST Funds to Capital Water Meter Loan Fund. Passed all ayes roll vote: Ayes: Hoffarth, Enabnit, Schlader, and Seibert.
- 16. Public Works Employee Daniel Paulus reported on mowing and spraying.
- 17. Discussion was held on the burning ordinance and the procedure on what residents should do if they have a complaint on someone illegally burning.

**Reminder:** City code 105.05 Open Burning Restricted. No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of combustible materials where the products of combustion are emitted into the open air

without passing through a chimney or stack, except that open burning is permitted in the following circumstances: Disaster Rubbish, Trees and Tree Trimmings, Flare Stacks, Landscape Waste, Recreational Fires, Training Fires, Pesticide Containers and Seed Corn Bags, Agricultural Structures, Controlled Burning of a Demolished Building, and Variance. Please see City Hall for the restrictions on each of these categories, and if necessary, to fill out a complaint form for possible violation.

The Freedom Rock light structure project started two years ago. Federal law says anything with a flag on it should be lit at night. Al Christeson and the local veterans got together, toured other freedom rocks in other counties to get ideas for a lighted structure over our rock that has a large U.S flag on it. Concerns about blocking the bandstand structure were considered. Due to covid, the materials for the project took two years to arrive. Wayne Martin of Industrial Piping in Nora Springs welded the stainless-steel piping that will contain the 110 led lights to automatically light the Freedom Rock when the city streetlights come on. Mike Ross will do the wiring once all the lights have arrived. The Rockford light plant will set them up once wired. All funds for this almost \$6,000.00 project were raised through the JT motorcycle ride, Thunder on the plains. This years event is coming up in August, details will be in the next newsletter.




