REGULAR MEETING FEBRUARY 13th, 2024, 7:30 P.M.

- The Rockford City Council met in regular session at City Hall on Tuesday, February 13th, 2024. Mayor Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Present were Council Members Schlader, Seibert, Johnson, Enabnit, and Medlin at 7:31 P.M. Citizens present were Bill Dow, Tod Cleghorn, Spenser Gruis, and Liz Enabnit. Also present were Public Works Employee Randy Schweizer and Dan Paulus.
 - Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert to approve the agenda as posted. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 2. Motion Schlader, sec. Johnson to approve the consent agenda consisting of January 16th Council Minutes, Monthly Reports, Claims and Expenses. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 3. Motion Schlader, sec. Enabnit to donate \$551.00 to the Nora Springs Ambulance Service. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 4. Motion Enabnit, sec. Medlin to approve half of the cost with RRMR School to replace the school crossing stop sign on wheels at the intersection of East Main Ave and 9th Street with two solar powered LED blinking stop signs. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
- 5. Motion Johnson, sec. Enabnit to set the City-Wide Clean-up dates from June 5th 9th, with 4 30 yard dumpsters to be put at the city dump for in town residents only. Appliances will also need to be taken to dump with purchase of sticker. Appliance stickers will be sold at city hall. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.

- 16. Motion Enabnit, sec. Seibert to approve Resolution #2024-07 Memorandum of Understanding between the Iowa Department of Revenue and City of Rockford regarding the state setoff program. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 17. Motion Medlin, sec. Schlader to approve Fiscal Year 2024-2025 contract with Gworks Hub for city financial software and to share half the cost with the Rockford Municipal Light Plant. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
- 18. Discussion was held with the council on annually raising water and sewer rates for rising costs of expenses.
- 19. Public Works Employee Randy Schweizer reported on lead & copper survey, ambulance call, water main break and water main fix.
- 20. Mayor Johnson reported on changes to city insurance, meeting with Floyd County Supervisors and the Annual 28E agreement cost rising.


