Motion Hirv, sec. Stokes to approve the posted agenda. Passed all ayes roll call vote.

2. Motion Johnson, sec. Hirv to approve the consent agenda consisting of November 10th, 2020 minutes, monthly reports, claims and expenses. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
3. 4 way STOP sign tabled until next meeting.
4. Burning concerns tabled until a later date to ensure solid waste committee the time to meet and discuss burning ordinance.
