

ROCKFORD CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

**JUNE 8TH, 2021
7:30 P.M.**

1. The Rockford City Council met in regular session at the Rockford Community Center to help ensure adequate space for social distancing on Tuesday, June 8, 2021. Mayor Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Present were Council Members Johnson, Hoffarth, Hirv, Stokes and Arndt was absent. Also present were Public Works Employees Randy Schweizer and Daniel Paulus.

Motion Stokes, sec. Hirv to approve the agenda as posted. Passed all ayes roll call vote.

2. Motion Stokes, sec. Hirv to approve the consent agenda consisting of May 11 & 17, 2021 Council Minutes, Monthly Reports, Claims and Expenses, and Yesway tobacco permit. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
3. Discussion was held on the meeting with the city engineer and Iowa DNR about the sewer lagoon project.
4. Motion Johnson, sec. Hirv giving the Fun Days committee permission to use Central Park and to block off streets to be used for Rockford Fun Days/JT Days on July 24th, 2021 and also to have a copy of the license and liability paperwork into City Hall for fireworks. Passed all ayes. Motion carried.
5. Discussion was held on where to set the new park equipment the city purchased for George Wyatt Campground.
6. Motion Johnson, sec. Hoffarth to approve Resolution #2021-11 28E Law Enforcement Agreement with the Floyd County Sheriff's Department. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
7. Sewer Project Reserve is tabled until next meeting
8. Well Pump Transfer is tabled until next meeting.
9. Motion Johnson sec, Hirv approving Resolution #2021-12 Authorizing Transfer of Water funds to the Capital Water Meter Project Fund on July 1, 2021. Passed all ayes roll call vote.
10. Public Works Director Randy Schweizer showed the council a film of what the Well Pump looked like after the pump was pulled for replacement of new one. Public Works Assistant Dan Paulus discussed the flushing of hydrants that have been done since the new well pump has been put in. Discussion was also held on setting up a scheduled maintenance cleaning on the well pumps.

11. Mayor Johnson reported on a water complaint, well pump cleaning maintenance, the city attorney working on city property deed and meetings with Floyd County Emergency Management and Floyd County Landfill.
